Today, she has successfully completed all her coursework and will graduate in March of 2021.

The challenging journey of transitioning to the world of the disabled inspired her to become an advocate for people living with disabilities. Bridgette has been a member of a Mighty Army of Prayer Warriors for approximately three years. She has served on many nonprofits organizations, including Vision Rehabilitation Services as an Intake and Assessment Specialist; American Cancer Society as an educator; and the National Federation of the Blind Cobb County Chapter as 2nd Vice-President.
